KING'S REGULATION

TO AMEND THE SOLOMONS (QUARANTINE)
REGULATION 1916.

Made by His Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific under the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council 1893.

In the name of His Majesty, George the Fifth, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India.

1. This Regulation may be cited as the Solomons (Quarantine) Amendment Regulation 1916

SHORT TITLE.

2. The Solomons (Quarantine) Regulation 1916 is hereby amended as follows:—

AMENDMENT OF
SECTIONS 11 AND
27 OF KING'S
REGULATION 3
OF 1916.

(1) In section eleven the words "a communicable" are repealed and the words "an infectious or contagious" are inserted in their place;

(2) In section twenty-seven the words "or otherwise committing any offence against" are inserted after the words "prohibited by."
