## KING'S REGULATION

TO PROVIDE FOR THE PAYMENT WITHIN THE BRITISH SOLOMON ISLANDS PROTECTORATE OF CERTAIN MONEYS IN COIN OF THE UNITED KINGDOM.

Made by His Britannic Majesty's Acting High Commissioner for the Western Pacific under the authority of His Majesty's Commission.

In the name of His Majesty, GEORGE V., of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India.

1. This Regulation may be cited as the Solomons Currency Regulation, 1910. Short title.
2. All taxes, duties, fees, fines and wages which shall be payable within the limits of the British Solomon Islands Protectorate shall be paid in coin of the United Kingdom. Payments in British coin.
- 3.—(1) Any person who shall pay, or make any agreement to pay, the wages of a labourer in articles of trade or in kind shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings. Penalty for payment of wages in trade or kind.  
(2) Every agreement so to pay wages shall be null and void.
