KING'S REGULATION

TO AMEND THE PRESERVATION OF ORDER REGULATION, 1922.

Made by His Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific under the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council 1893.

In the name of His Majesty George the Fifth, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India.

1. This Regulation may be cited as the Preservation of Order MORI WILL. (Amendment) Regulation 1924.

2. Section 3, subsection (2) of the Preservation of Order Regula- section 3 (2) tion, 1922, is hereby repealed and the following subsections shall NO. 18 OF 1822

be substituted therefor:-

(2) Any person found in any dwelling-house or in any verandah TRESPASS WITH or passage attached thereto or in any yard garden or other land interest adjacent to or within the curtilage of such dwelling-house with ANNOYFIMALIS intent indecently to insult or annoy any female inmate of such dwelling-house shall be liable on conviction to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term not exceeding six months and in addition to or in lieu of any such sentence of imprisonment may be ordered by the Court in the case of a male sixteen years of age or over to be flogged, and in case of a male under sixteen years of age to be whipped.

(3) Every such flogging or whipping as the case may be shall be subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the Corporal Punishment Regulation 1924.
