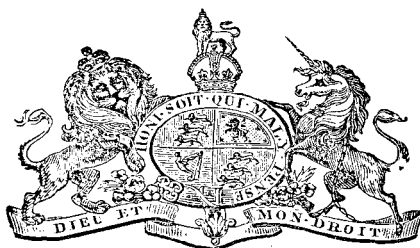

KING'S REGULATION

TO AMEND THE SOLOMONS (ARMS) REGULATION, 1897.

Made by His Britannic Majesty's Acting High Commissioner for the Western Pacific under and by the authority of His Majesty's Commission.

In the name of His Majesty, George the Fifth, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India.

1. This Regulation may be cited as the Solomons Arms (Amendment) Regulation, 1910. Short title.

2. The definition of the term "superior officer" in section one of the Solomons (Arms) Regulation, 1897, is hereby repealed and the following definition is substituted therefor:— Amendment of Regulation No. IV. of 1897, section 1.

" 'Superior officer' shall mean and include the Resident Commissioner for the Protectorate, a Deputy Commissioner for the Western Pacific, an officer of His Majesty's Navy on full pay, and a magistrate or a superior officer of Police in the Protectorate."

3. Section two of the Solomons (Arms) Regulation, 1897, is hereby repealed and the following provisions are substituted therefor:—

“ 2.—(1). Any person, other than a superior officer, who directly or indirectly sells, or gives, or lends, or supplies, or is a party to, or concerned in selling, giving, lending or supplying, or counsels or assists any other person to sell, give, lend or supply, any arms or ammunition to a native in any circumstances whatever shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation.

“ (2). The provisions of the preceding subsection shall not apply to a trader or settler in the Protectorate who permits a native in his employ to use his shot-gun and cartridge ammunition to shoot birds or other animals for the purposes of food, provided that the permission under this subsection be not given to more than one native on any one day of twenty-four hours.”
