KING'S REGULATION

TO AMEND THE SOLOMONS CUSTOMS REGULATION 1907.

Made by His Britannic Majesty's Acting High Commissioner for the Western Pacific under the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council 1893.

In the name of His Majesty GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India.

1. This Regulation may be cited for all purposes as the Solomons Customs (Amendment) Regulation 1924 and shall be read and construed with the Solomons Customs Regulation 1907 hereinafter referred to as the principal Regulation. SHORT TITLE.

2. Section forty-one of the principal Regulation is hereby amended and the following subsection shall be added thereto: AMENDMENT OF SECTION 41 OF KING'S REGULATION NO. 2 OF 1907.
"The time at which any goods shall be shipped on board any export ship shall be deemed to be the time of exportation from the Protectorate of such goods."
