

AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 18-35, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 18-49, 18-61, 18-63, 18-78, 18-98 and 18-111, by amending sections 2 and 4, thereof, to change the use of funds previously appropriated therein, to fund public projects and social programs for the people of Yap and Chuuk States, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 2 of Public Law No. 18-35, as amended by
2 Public Law No. 18-49 and 18-61, is hereby further amended to read
