To amend the Social Services Ordinance
1956-1964.

Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, hereby
make the following Ordinance.

SOCIAL SERVICES ORDINANCE 1965.

Short title
and citation.

1.- (1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the
Social Services Ordinance 1965.

(2.) The Social Services Ordinance 1956-1964 *
is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal
Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended
by this Ordinance, may be cited as the Social Services
Ordinance 1956-1965.

Commencement.

2. This Ordinance shall come into operation
on the fourteenth day of February, One thousand
nine hundred and sixty-six.

Payment in instalments.

3. Section 26 of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting sub-section(3.) and inserting in its stead the following sub-section:

"(3.) Where the amount so ascertained as affected by the Currency Act 1965 in its application in Nauru, is not a multiple of Ten cents, the amount shall be increased or decreased to the nearest multiple of Ten cents, except where the amount is a multiple of Five cents, in which case the amount shall be increased by Five cents."

Payment in instalments.

4. Section 42 of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting sub-section (3.) and inserting in its stead the following sub-section:

"(3.) Where the amount so ascertained, as affected by the Currency Act 1965 in its application in Nauru, is not a multiple of Ten cents, the amount shall be increased or decreased to the nearest multiple of Ten cents, except where the amount is a multiple of Five cents, in which case the amount shall be increased by Five cents."
