To amend the Social Services Ordinance 1956-1964.

I, the Administrator of the Island of Nauru, in pursuance of the powers conferred by Article '1 of the Agreement dated the second day of July, 1919, between the Government of the United Kingdom, the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia and the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, hereby make the following Ordinance.

SOCIAL SERVICES ORDINANCE 1965.

Short title and citation.

Commencement.
1.- (1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the Social Services Ordinance 1965.
(2.) The Social Services Ordinance 1956-1964 is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.
(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the Social Services Ordinance 1956-1965.
2. This Ordiiance shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-six.

Payment in instalments.
3. Section 26 of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting sub-section(3.) and inserting in its stead the following sub-section:
"(3.) Where the amount so ascertained as affected by the Currency Act 1965 in its application in Nauru, is not a multiple of Ten cents, the amount shall be increased or decreased to the nearest multiple of Ten cents, except where the amount is a nultiple of Five cents, in which case the amount shall be increased by Five cents.".
4. Section 42 of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting sub-section (3.) and inserting in its stead the following sub-section:
"(3.) Where the amount so ascertained, as affected by the Currency Act 1965 in its application in Nauru, is not a multiple of Ten cents, the amount shall be increased or decreased to the nearest multiple of Ten cents, except where the amount is a multiple of Five cents, in which case the amount shall be increased by Five cents.".
