# **CONSTITUTION OF NAURU**

### **ARTICLE 77**

#### DECLARATION OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY

#### WHEREAS

- A. On 11 June 2010, being satisfied after 6 weeks and 14 sittings of Parliament since General Elections had been held on 24<sup>th</sup> April 2010 for Members of the 19<sup>th</sup> Parliament, that the inability of Parliament to consider any financial Bills and the essential need for supplementary appropriation constituted a grave threat to economy of Nauru, I declared a State of Emergency under Article 77 of the Constitution of Nauru.
- B. The State of Emergency declared on 11 June 2010, having been declared when Parliament was not sitting, will lapse at the expiration of the Second day of July 2010, such date being the expiration of twenty-one days after the date of publication of the declaration.
- C. In an attempt to end the political stalemate that has persisted in Nauru since March 2010 I have twice called General Elections, such elections having taken place on 24<sup>th</sup> April 2010 and 19<sup>th</sup> June 2010, the latter occasion having been an election called under Emergency Powers.
- D. Despite extensive negotiations and attempts to reach a compromise since General Elections were held for Members of the 20<sup>th</sup> Parliament on the 19<sup>th</sup> of June, 2010, the 20<sup>th</sup> Parliament has remained unable to progress to the election of the President due to the ongoing political stalemate. This has also resulted in the inability of the Parliament to entertain any other business, including any Appropriation or financial Bills.
- E. Despite all the efforts that have been made to find a political resolution to enable the 20<sup>th</sup> Parliament to progress, I am now convinced that whilst a political resolution would be desirable, unfortunately the political stalemate cannot be broken and would otherwise persist.
- F. Due to the ongoing political stalemate and the inability of Parliament to consider a Supply Bill, I issued on 30 June 2010 in exercise of my emergency powers a Presidential Order (Presidential Order No.9) for the purpose of meeting expenditure necessary to carry on the services of the Republic of Nauru after the commencement of the new financial year until Parliament is able to approve an appropriation law.
- G. In order for Presidential Order No.9 to remain in force, which is essential as a consequence of the ongoing political deadlock and Parliament's inability to consider and vote on any appropriation bills, the only feasible option available to government to ensure the functions of government, the welfare of our people and social stability, is to exercise the authority available to me under Article 77(1) and 77(5) of the Constitution to make a further declaration of a State of Emergency.

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H. The situation has been reviewed by the President in Cabinet and having been satisfied, on the advice that I have received, that there continues to exist a grave threat to the economy of the Republic;

**NOW THEREFORE,** in accordance with Article 77 of the Constitution of Nauru, I, **MARCUS STEPHEN**, President of the Republic of Nauru, publicly **PROCLAIM** as follows:

- 1. A State of Emergency exists in Nauru.
- 2. That the Constitution of the Republic of Nauru shall remain in place, except for those Articles of the Constitution specifically excluded from application and operation by Presidential Order made under Part IX of the Constitution.
- 3. This Proclamation shall come in to force at once and will lapse upon the election by Parliament of a President, or after 7 days, whichever occurs sooner.
- 4. This proclamation may be extended by further proclamations.

DECLARED at NAURU this Second day of July, 2010 at 7 pm.

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### CONSTITUTION OF NAURU PART IX EMERGENCY POWERS

### PRESIDENTIAL ORDER 10 ARTICLE 78

A State of Emergency having been declared under Article 77(1) of the Constitution of Nauru and, being satisfied that this order is reasonably required to safeguard the interests of the community, by virtue of the powers vested in me under Article 78(1) of the Constitution of Nauru, I MARCUS STEPHEN, President of the Republic of Nauru hereby order as follows:

- 1. Notwithstanding that Presidential Order 3 dated 11 June 2010 (limiting actions to the Supreme Court) and Presidential Order 9 dated 30 June 2010 (providing for supply) would otherwise lapse with the lapsing of the State of Emergency declared by me on 11 June 2010, the said Orders shall continue in force.
- 2. Each roll of electors kept under section 6 of the *Electoral Act* shall remain closed until the lapse of the State of Emergency declared by me on 2 July 2010 or until further order.

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#### CONSTITUTION OF NAURU PART IX EMERGENCY POWERS

#### PRESIDENTIAL ORDER 11 ARTICLE 78

A State of Emergency having been declared under Article 77(1) of the Constitution of Nauru and, being satisfied that this order is reasonably required to safeguard the interests of the community, by virtue of the powers vested in me under Article 78(1) of the Constitution of Nauru, I MARCUS STEPHEN, President of the Republic of Nauru hereby order as follows:

1. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the *Customs Tariff Act 1997-2007*, from 1 July 2010 the following rates of customs duty shall apply-

Dutiable goods	Rate of customs duty
Cigarettes	\$105.00 per 1,000 cigarettes
Cigars and tobacco other than cigarettes	\$52.50 per 500 grams

2. In respect of all dutiable goods other than those specified in paragraph 1 of this Order, the rates of duty prescribed in the *Customs Tariff Act 1997-2007* continue to apply.
