NOTICE

In the interests of public safety and public order, the Government of the Republic of Nauru being entitled to possession, control or management of important premises, the purpose for which is to provide the public with fundamental services, hereby reminds and gives notice to all, that all Republic owned, Republic leased or premises lawfully used by the Republic including such premises owned or leased by State owned enterprises and instrumentalities of the Republic, may only be accessed by authorised persons or lawful persons on legitimate business. These premises include:

- 1. Tank Farm
- 2. Power Station and Nauru Utilities Corporation buildings and installations
- 3. Aerodrome which includes the tarmac, airport and airstrip
- 4. All government schools
- 5. The Republic of Nauru Hospital
- 6. Naoero Public Health Centre
- 7. All Government premises including buildings, installations and infrastructure
- 8. Parliament Building located at Yaren
- 9. The Court House located at Yaren
- 10. Nauru's Harbours and Ports
- 11. All areas where phosphate mining is being conducted including mining infrastructure and installations across Nauru
- 12. All premises, including buildings, installations and infrastructure owned or leased by state owned enterprises and instrumentalities of the Republic

Pursuant to section 277 of the Criminal Code, any police, manager or authorised agent of the Government acting with its authority is entitled to remove or defend any such land, premises or sites against trespassers and to remove any person or persons who are not lawfully entitled to be or who remains on such land or premises.

"Legitimate business" includes access and use of the said premises by members of the public for the purpose for which the premises have been established.

Sanctions range depending on the circumstances of the unauthorized access and entry, from \$200 to \$10000 penalty and or a 1 year imprisonment. Trespassers may also be subjected to further civil or criminal legal action.
