## AN ORDINANCE

*To Amend the "Post and Telegraph Ordinance, 1912-1916."*

**B**E it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor of the Territory of Papua with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Post and Telegraph Ordinance, 1920.* Short title and citation.

(2) In this Ordinance the *Post and Telegraph Ordinance, 1912-1916*, is referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3) The Principal Ordinance as amended by this Ordinance may be cited as the *Post and Telegraph Ordinance, 1912-1920.*

Commencement.

2. This Ordinance shall commence on a date to be fixed by the Lieutenant-Governor by Proclamation published in the *Gazette*.

Newspapers.

3. Part I. of the Third Schedule to the Principal Ordinance is repealed and the following Part inserted in its stead :—

“ PART I.—NEWSPAPERS.

<p>On all newspapers printed and published in the Territory or Australia posted for delivery within the Territory (without condition as to the number contained in each addressed wrapper) by—</p> <p>(a) the proprietors thereof to <i>bond fide</i> subscribers and to newsvendors and agents for <i>bond fide</i> trade requirements ;</p> <p>(b) newsvendors and agents to <i>bond fide</i> subscribers and to other newsvendors and agents for <i>bond fide</i> trade requirements ; and</p> <p>(c) newsvendors and agents for return to the publishing office.</p> <p>On other newspapers posted within the Territory for delivery therein</p>	<p>One penny and a halfpenny per twenty ounces on the aggregate weight of newspapers posted by any one person at any one time : Provided that the minimum amount of postage payable on the aggregate weight of newspapers so posted shall be One shilling.</p> <p>For each newspaper—One penny per ten ounces or part of ten ounces.”</p>

4. Part II. of the Third Schedule to the Principal Ordinance is repealed and the following Part inserted in its stead :—

Magazines, that is to say—	
(a) Magazines, reviews and other similar publications wholly set up and printed in the Territory or Australia and published for sale in numbers at intervals not exceeding three months ...	For each magazine, 1d. per 8 ozs. or part of 8 ozs.
(b) Magazines, reviews and other similar publications (including newspapers) not wholly set up and printed in the Territory or Australia, and published for sale in numbers at intervals not exceeding three months ...	For each magazine, 1d. per 4 ozs. or part of 4 ozs.
Catalogues wholly set up and printed in the Territory or Australia ... ..	For each catalogue, 1½d. per 4 ozs. or part of 4 ozs.
<i>Hansard</i> , that is reports of Parliamentary debates printed and published by the authority of the Commonwealth or of a State or of a Territory ... ..	1d. per 12 ozs. or part of 12 ozs.
Commercial papers, patterns, samples and merchandise, as prescribed ... ..	1½d. per 2 ozs. or part of 2 ozs.”
