## AN ORDINANCE

To Amend the "Post and Telegraph Ordinance, 1912-1920."

$B$E it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor of the Territory of Papua with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:-

1. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the Post and short titile and Telegraph Ordinance, 1924.
(2) In this Ordinance the Post and Telegraph Ordinance, 1912-1920, is referred to as the Principal Ordinance.
(3) The Principal Ordinance as amended by this Ordinance may be cited as the Post and Telegraph Ordinance, 1912-1924.

Commencement.
2. This Ordinance shall commence on the fourth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four.
3. Part I of the Third Schedule to the Pxincipal Ordinance is repealed and the following Part inserted in its stead :-

## "PART I-NEWSPAPERS.

On all newspapers printed and published in the Territory or Australia posted for delivery within the Territory (without condition as to the number contained in each addressed wrapper) by-
(a) the proprietors thereof to bona fide subscribers and to newsvendors and agents for bona fide trade requirements;
(b) newsvendors and agents to bona fide subscribers and to other newsvendors and agents for bona fide trade requirements; and
(c) newsvendors and agents for return to the publishing office.
On other newspapers posted within the Territory for delivery therein

One penny and a halfpenny per twenty ounces on the aggregate weight of newspapers posted by any one person at any one time:
Provided that the minimum amount of postage payable on the aggregate weight of newspapers so posted shall be One shilling.

Postal articles.
4. Part II of the Third Schedule to the Principal Ordinance is repealed and the following Part inserted in its stead :-
