## STATUTORY RULES.

No. 3 of 1923.

By-laws made under the Land Ordinance, 1911-1922.

PY virtue of all the powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Port Moresby Swimming Baths, the said Trustees make the following By-laws.

- 1. These By-laws may be cited as the Port Moresby Swimming Baths By-laws, 1923.
  - 2. The baths shall be open at all times to both sexes.
- 3. Separate dressing rooms are provided for men, women, boys and girls and are marked accordingly and all persons must use only those separate dressing rooms allotted to them:
- 4. All persons must be decently clothed. The costume to be worn by both sexes is to be from neck to knee.
- 5. No person shall wilfully damage the property of the Trustees or commit a nuisance of any kind on any of the premises.
  - 6. No native shall be allowed in the baths or on any of the premises.
- 7. No dogs shall be allowed in the baths or on any of the premises and the owner or keeper of any dog trespassing in or on the baths or premises shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
- 8. All bathers and other persons shall observe the comfort and convenience of others, both in the dressing rooms and in the water and especially shall refrain from all acts which are likely to endanger or frighten persons who cannot swim or children.
- 9. Any person who commits a breach of or is guilty of an offence against any of these By-laws shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 10. The By-laws made on the 1st April, 1915 and gazetted on 7th April, 1915 are repealed.
