STATUTORY RULES.

No. 7 of 1938.

Made under the Native Regulation Ordinance, 1908-1930.

The Native Regulations, 1931 (Statutory Rules No. 7 of 1931), are further amended as follows:—

1. By adding at the end of Sub-regulation (2) of Regulation 95 the following further paragraph:—

"(f) Any native exempted by the Lieutenant-Governor by Order in

Council published in the Gazette."

2. By adding at the end of Regulation 99 the following further sub-regulation:—

"(7) (a) Any Government Medical Officer may require a female native to submit to an examination of her person with a view to ascertaining whether she suffers from a venereal disease and it shall be an offence under this regulation for her without reasonable excuse proof whereof shall lie upon her to refuse or neglect to submit accordingly.

An examination made pursuant to this paragraph of this sub-regulation shall be made in the presence of a suitable third person.

(b) Any European Medical Assistant may require a male native to submit to an examination of his person with a view to ascertaining if he suffers from a venereal disease and it shall be an offence under this regulation for him without reasonable excuse proof whereof shall lie upon him to refuse or neglect to submit accordingly."
