

STATUTORY RULES.

No. 11 of 1917.

REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER "THE NATIVE REGULATION ORDINANCE OF 1908."

(No. XXV. of 1909).

1. The Regulations dealing with Native Matters made under *The Native Regulation Ordinance of 1908*, on the fifteenth day of March, 1911, and published in the *Gazette* dated the 24th day of April, 1911, are amended as follows:—

(i) By inserting the following new Regulation after Regulation 82:—

"82A. (1) If any native shall have in his possession any article used or capable of being used for clothing or bedding and which in the opinion of a Magistrate is in such a condition as to be a source of danger to the health of such native or any other native such Magistrate may order the native in whose possession it is to burn such article.

(2) If any native disobeys an order under this Regulation he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One pound or in default of payment to imprisonment for any term not exceeding Two months or to such imprisonment in the first instance.

(3) No compensation shall be paid for any article so burned."

(ii) By cancelling paragraphs (8) and (9) of Regulation 87 and substituting the following paragraph therefor:—

"(8) Any native—

(a) who is liable to be selected to carry for the Government and who runs away, hides, or absents himself to avoid being selected for that purpose; or

(b) who after having been selected by the Chief or Village Constable to carry for the Government refuses or wilfully neglects to do so—

shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds or in default of payment to imprisonment for any period not exceeding Three months or to such imprisonment in the first instance."

(iii) By inserting in paragraph (10) of Regulation 111 after the words "to arrest offenders" the words "inside or."
