

# STATUTORY RULES.

No. 9 of 1921.

## REGULATIONS

Made under the *Native Taxes Ordinance, 1917-1919.*

### *Citation.*

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Native Taxes (General Purposes) Regulations, 1921.*

### *Grants for Education.*

2. (a) Each mission and the Kwato Extension Association may be granted a sum of £1,000 a year for five years to be expended on primary and technical education according to a scheme to be approved by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council. The scheme may vary in the case of the different missions but no scheme shall be approved which does not make sufficient provision for technical education.

(b) An officer thereto appointed by the Lieutenant-Governor shall have the right to enter schools and workshops and make such investigation as may be necessary for the purpose of ascertaining whether the scheme is being carried out; if the scheme is not carried out the Lieutenant-Governor may reduce the grant or may revoke it altogether.

(c) Sums not exceeding in any instance £250 in any one year may be granted to any mission station for the purpose of special industrial or other training.

### *Native Plantations.*

3. A sum not exceeding £1,000 in any one year may be expended on native plantations in the appointment of inspectors and instructors, native assistants and other necessary officers, and in travelling expenses, stationery, seeds, tools and other incidentals.

### *Anthropology.*

4. A sum not exceeding £1,000 in any one year may be expended on the appointment of an anthropologist, assistant anthropologist, native assistants and other necessary officers, in travelling expenses, stationery and other incidentals and on payment of officers for special reports upon matters solely connected with natives.

### *Medical.*

5. (a) A sum not exceeding £2,000 in any one year may be expended on the medical care of natives and the sanitation of native villages, the appointment of medical officers for this purpose and of assistants and other necessary officers, on the purchase or hire of launches and other vessels and on other incidentals including stationery and necessary buildings.

(b) A sum not exceeding in any year £100 to any one mission may be paid to the missions, at the rate of 10s. for every £1 spent by the mission, for medical treatment of natives.

### *Village Improvements.*

6. A sum not exceeding £1,000 in any one year may be spent on water supply and other necessary improvements to native villages.
