STATUTORY RULES.

No. 4 of 1926.

Made under the Quarantine Ordinance, 1913-1922.

The Quarantine Regulations, 1922 (Statutory Rules No. 1 of 1923), are amended by adding to Part III thereof after Regulation 35 the following new Regulation:—

"Notification of Cases of Disease by Master.

35A. The master of any vessel in any port in Papua shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Quarantine Officer of that port of every case which he believes or suspects to be a case of any of the diseases mentioned hereunder which is on his vessel when she arrives in the port or which may arise on his vessel while she remains in the port:—

Anterior Polio-myelitis
Scarlet fever
Chancroid
Chickenpox
Whooping Cough
Gonorrhœa
Syphilis
Chancre
Chancroid
Dynereal Bubo
Tuberculosis
Pneumonia

The notice shall be in the following form:-

I, , Master of the vessel , hereby give notice to the Quarantine Officer of the Port of that the persons named hereunder are suffering or are suspected to be suffering from (here mention the disease or suspected disease).
