## PROCLAMATION MADE PURSUANT TO SECTION 5 OF THE CEMETERIES ORDINANCE 1935-1936 DECLARING LAND TO BE A CEMETERY.

### PROCLAMATION.<sup>(1)</sup>

**W**HEREAS by section 5 of the *Cemeteries Ordinance* 1935-1936 of the Territory of New Guinea, it is amongst other things provided that the Administrator may declare by notice any area of Administration land described in the notice to be a Cemetery:

And whereas it is desired to establish a cemetery at Lorengau in the Territory of New Guinea:

Now therefore, I, the Acting Administrator of the Territory of Papua and New Guinea, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Ordinance* 1935-1936 of the Territory of New Guinea and all other powers me enabling, do hereby proclaim and declare the area of Administration land described in the Schedule hereto to be a Cemetery for the purposes of the said Ordinance.

### THE SCHEDULE.

All that piece of land situated at Lorengau District of Manus Territory of New Guinea containing an area of approximately two acres commencing from a point being the intersection of the south-western boundary of the Lorengau-Lombrum Road with the south-eastern boundary of the school road and being approximately 1,495 yards along the said Lorengau-Lombrum Road westerly from a cement mark near the bridge over the Lorengau River and bounded thence by the said south-eastern boundary of the school road being a straight line bearing magnetic 212 degrees for 176 yards and bounded thence on the south-west by a straight line bearing magnetic 114 degrees for 82 yards and bounded thence on the south-east by a straight line bearing magnetic 32 degrees for 70 yards and bounded thence on the north-east by a straight line bearing magnetic

302 degrees for 53 yards and bounded thence again on the south-east by a straight line bearing magnetic 32 degrees for 95 yards to the south-western boundary of the Lorengau-Lombrum Road aforesaid and bounded thence again on the north-east by part of the said south-western boundary of the Lorengau-Lombrum Road being a straight line bearing magnetic 302 degrees for 28 yards to the point of commencement be the said several dimensions all a little more or less.

Given under my Hand at Port Moresby, this seventeenth day of March, One thousand nine hundred and fifty and in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign.
