

**AMENDMENT OF THE ELECTRICITY (PORT MORESBY) REGULATIONS, 1932.<sup>(1)</sup>**

**Statutory Rules.**

**No. 3 of 1950.**

1. Regulation 8A of the *Electricity (Port Moresby) Regulations, 1932*,<sup>(2)</sup> is amended by inserting immediately after sub-regulation 3 thereof the following new sub-regulation:—

“(4.) The Administrator in Council may, by notice in writing to the Electric Authority, grant for any period of time and for any reason he deems fit, a rebate to any class of consumer on the amounts payable under these regulations.”

(1) Particulars of this Regulation are as follows:—

(a) Repealed by the *Electricity Supply Ordinance 1951* but the regulations made thereunder were continued in force by Section 3 (2).

(b) This Regulation stated in its introductory part that it was “to come into operation forthwith”. At the relevant dates in 1950 the *Port Moresby Electric Light and Power Ordinance, 1925-1938* (under which this Regulation was made) made no provision as to the date of commencement of regulations made thereunder but Section 37 (1) of the *Ordinances Interpretation Ordinance 1949* of the Territory of Papua and New Guinea provided that “Regulations . . . made . . . under an Ordinance, unless the contrary intention appears in the Ordinance—

(a) shall be published in the *Gazette*; and

(b) shall . . . take effect from the date of publication, or where another date is specified in the regulations, from the date specified.”

At the relevant dates in 1950, there was no Ordinance or regulation of general application providing for the meaning of “forthwith”.
