An Ordinance to amend the Laws Repeal and Adopting Ordinance 1921-1923, as amended by Ordinance No. 1 of 1924 and Ordinance No. 22 of 1924, and for other purposes.

DE it ordained by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the New Guinea Act 1920, as follows:—

1.-(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the Laws Repeal and Short title and Adopting Ordinance 1925.

(2.) The Laws Repeal and Adopting Ordinance 1921-1923, as amended by the Laws Repeal and Adopting Ordinance 1924 (No. 1 of 1924) and by the Laws Repeal and Adopting Ordinance 1924 (No. 22 of 1924), is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) Sub-section (3.) of section one of the Laws Repeal and Adopting. Ordinance 1924 (No. 1 of 1924) is repealed.

(4.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the Laws Repeal and Adopting Ordinance 1921-1925.

LAWS (ADOPTION AND INTERPRETATION)-

Meaning of Minister in Ordinances, &c., set out in Fourth Schedule to Principal Ordinance.

5.—(1.) In any Ordinance, order, regulation or other legislative act set out in the Fourth Schedule to the Principal Ordinance any reference to the Minister or to any Minister shall be deemed to be a reference to the Minister of State for the time being administering the New Guinea Act 1920.

(2.) This section shall be deemed to have commenced on the eighteenth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three.
