# RAPINDIK LANDS ORDINANCE 1931. (1)

### No. 6 of 1931.

## An Ordinance Relating to Certain Land at Rapindik.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the New Guinea Act 1920-1926, as follows:—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Rapindik Lands Short title. Ordinance 1931. (1)
- 2. The notice of resumption (2) of the land described in the Notice of Schedule to this Ordinance, and published in the New Guinea Gazette on the first day of October, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, shall be deemed to be, and at all times to have been, inoperative and of no effect.

### THE SCHEDULE.

All that piece of land situated at Rapindik in the Administrative District of New Britain containing approximately 101 hectares commencing at a point on the eastern bank of Sulphur Creek bearing true 301 degrees 41 minutes and distant 15 metres from a marked point being the most southerly corner of the property known as Matupi Farm and bounded thence on the northeast, north-west and north by south-western, south-eastern and southern boundaries of Matupi Farm aforesaid being marked lines bearing true 121 degrees 41 minutes for 15 metres, 41 degrees 41 minutes for 332 and 8/10 metres and 88 degrees 25 minutes for 86 metres; thence again on the north, and on the west and south by the southern, eastern and northern boundaries of an Administration property known as the Sanitary Depot being marked lines bearing true 88 degrees 25 minutes 20 seconds for 170 metres, 358 degrees 25 minutes 20 seconds for 100 metres, and 268 degrees 25 minutes 20 seconds for 170 metres to a marked point on an eastern boundary of Matupi Farm aforesaid; thence again on the west by part of the said eastern boundary of Matupi Farm being a marked line bearing true 358 degrees 25 minutes for 247 and 83/100 metres; thence again on the north by part of the southern boundary of an Administration property, and a prolongation thereof being a line bearing true 88 degrees 30 minutes for about 285 metres, thence on the east by a line bearing true 178 degrees 25 minutes for about 410 metres to a marked point being the north-eastern corner of the Native Cemetery; thence by the north-western, south-western and southern boundaries of the said Native Cemetery being marked lines bearing magnetic 245 degrees 2 minutes 20 seconds for 201 and 41/100 metres, 120 degrees 39 minutes 30 seconds for

40 metres, 167 degrees 52 minutes 40 seconds for 219 and 97/100 metres and 85 degrees 8 minutes 20 seconds for 108 and 7/10 metres; thence on the north-east by a line bearing magnetic approximately 138 degrees 45 minutes for about 745 metres to a marked point being the north-eastern corner of an area of 18 hectares 66 ares being the property of the Administration; thence on the south-east and again on the north-east by the north-western and part of the south-western boundaries of the area of 18 hectares 77 ares aforesaid being marked lines bearing magnetic 247 degrees 10 minutes 50 seconds for 416 and 47/100 metres and 157 degrees 11 minutes 50 seconds for 230 metres; thence again on the south-east by a line magnetic 247 degrees 11 minutes 50 seconds for 100 metres; thence on the south-west by a line bearing magnetic 305 degrees for about 1,500 metres to a point on the shore of Simpson Harbour, thence by the said shore northerly for about 140 metres to Sulphur Creek aforesaid; thence again on the north by the southern bank of Sulphur Creek aforesaid easterly to the point of commencement.
