## ROADS MAINTENANCE REGULATIONS. (1)

- 1. The notice to repair and maintain under Sections 6 (1) and 8 of the above Ordinance shall be in the form in the First Schedule.
- 2. Service of notices to repair and maintain may be served on any day and at any time and proof that such notice was delivered to the owner lessee or occupier or left at his principal abode or residence or in the case of a native chief at his head village shall be sufficient.
- 3. Owners lessees or occupiers of land possessing a common frontage to a road may mutually agree as to which part or parts each is liable to maintain. In any case where owners lessees or occupiers of land possessing a common frontage to any length of road fail to agree as to which particular part or length of such road they are each liable to maintain, the District Officer shall decide as to their respective liability therefor.
- 4. Any person firm company or the Expropriation Board who wilfully or negligently obstructs any road by:
  - (a) Erecting any fence barricade or other obstruction thereon to the danger or hindrance of traffic;
  - (b) Allowing horses, oxen, sheep, goats, pigs or any other live stock to stray or graze thereon;
  - (c) Digging or excavating drains, ditches or causeways across any road in such position as to endanger or hinder traffic:
  - (d) Allowing any cart, conveyance or other vehicle to remain stationary and unattended on any road;
  - (e) Extinguishing removing or in any way interfering with any lamps or lights placed on or near any road for the pur-

5. Any person who is guilty of a breach of any of the Regulations made under the *Roads Maintenance Ordinance* 1922<sup>(2)</sup> for which no specified punishments are provided shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding £5.
