PROCLAMATIONS MADE PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 19 AND 20 OF THE PRISONS ORDINANCE, 1919-1930, PROCLAIMING PRISONS AND PENAL DISTRICTS.

**TEXT OF PROCLAMATIONS.**

[Proclamation dated 30th July, 1920, and published in Papua Govt. Gaz. of 4th August, 1920.]

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency JOHN HUBERT PLUNKETT MURRAY, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Territory of Papua.

I, John Hubert Plunkett Murray, the Lieutenant-Governor aforesaid, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that all buildings and premises at present or hereafter to be erected on that piece of land being the Government Station at Misima Island, in the said Territory, shall be a prison within the meaning of the provisions of the *Prisons Ordinance, 1919*, and I further proclaim that the whole of the said Island down to low-water mark shall be a penal district within the meaning of the provisions of the said Ordinance.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the said Territory this thirtieth day of July, in the year of Our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and twenty, and in the eleventh year of His Majesty's reign.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency HERBERT WILLIAM CHAMPION, Acting Lieutenant-Governor of the Territory of Papua.

H. W. CHAMPION.

I, Herbert William Champion, the Acting Lieutenant-Governor aforesaid, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that all buildings and premises situate upon the Government Reserve Badili, Central Division in this Territory, and all buildings and premises which may hereafter be erected, shall be a prison under the *Prisons Ordinance, 1919*, and I further proclaim that the area surrounding such prison and referred to in the Schedule hereto shall be a penal district under the aforesaid Ordinance:

And I further proclaim and declare that the Proclamation, bearing date the eighth day of August, 1919, and published in *Gazette* No. 16 of 1919, proclaiming a prison at Badili within the boundaries therein described, is hereby revoked.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the said Territory, at Port Moresby, this eighteenth day of November, in the year of Our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and in the eighteenth year of His Majesty's reign.

SCHEDULE.

Commencing at a point on the high-water mark of Walter Bay being the most Southerly corner of Portion 362; thence by a line bearing  $30^{\circ} 11'$  for a distance of three hundred and forty-eight and six-tenths links to the most Westerly corner of Subdivision 6 of Portion 6; thence by the South-West boundary of the aforesaid portion bearing  $121^{\circ} 33'$  for a distance of seven hundred and twenty-seven

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links; thence by the South boundary of the aforesaid portion  $880^{\circ} 41'$  for a distance of three hundred and sixty-five and seven-tenth links; thence by a line bearing  $178^{\circ} 41'$  for a distance of eighty-seven and five-tenths links to a point on the high-water mark of Walter Bay; thence on the South-East, South and South-West by the aforesaid high-water mark of Walter Bay to the point of commencement, being Portion 363.

Again commencing at the afore-mentioned point on the high-water mark of Walter Bay; thence on the East by part of the Western boundary of Portion 363 bearing  $30^{\circ} 11'$  for a distance of two hundred and forty-six links; thence on the North by the Southern side of a one-chain road bearing  $287^{\circ} 13'$  for a distance of four hundred and fifty links; thence by a line bearing  $210^{\circ} 11'$  for a distance of eighty links to the high-water mark aforesaid; thence on the South by the said high-water mark bearing generally South-Easterly to the point of commencement, being Portion 362.

Again commencing at the high-water mark of Walter Bay at the Northern extremity of Gabatu Motu Motu Island and thence by the high-water mark aforesaid bearing Southerly, Northerly and North-Easterly to the point of commencement, being the whole of the island of Gabatu Motu Motu, being Portion 364. All bearings true.
