CORRIGENDUM

IN the Notification of Registration of Paradise Bakery (Boroko) Pty. Limited which was gazetted on page 747 in *National Gazette* No. G55 of 13th September, 1984, certain undertakings which formed part of Condition 8 were inadvertently omitted through an oversight. The full set of NIDA Conditions of Registration should read as follows:—

1. The right to carry on business in an activity in respect of which the Enterprise is registered may be terminated or suspended by the Minister by not less than four years prior written notice to the Enterprise. Such notice shall not be given before the sixth anniversary of the date of registration.

2. As practical and appropriate, provision shall be made by the Enterprise for investment in, and participation in the ownership, management and control of the Enterprise by citizens. Control of the Enterprise shall be transferred to citizens hands as soon as practicable and reasonable, having regard to the nature of the Enterprise and its activities. NIDA will consider this requirement to have been complied with throughout the first five years of the period of registration of the Enterprise if citizens or local enterprises acquire and thereafter retain beneficial ownership of at least 26% of the Enterprise by the fifth anniversary of the date of registration.

3. The Enterprise shall not without the prior approval of the Minister establish a place of business in any location in Papua New Guinea other than Section 23, Allotments 13 and 14, Boroko; Section 37, Allotments 10 and 11, Hohola and Section 159, Allotments 1, 2 and 3, Lae.

4. The Enterprise will comply with all or any obligations and conditions relating to the training of employees and the localisation of its staff (including both employees and officers of the Enterprise) which may from time to time be laid down by the Department of Labour and Employment (or any other Department which succeeds to the functions of that Department) or prescribed or declared under the *Employment of Non-Citizens Act* as in force from time to time dealing with training and localisation of staff.

5. If without the consent of NIDA the Enterprise has not at the expiration of three months from the date of registration commenced carrying on business in the activity for which it is hereby registered, the registration of the Enterprise shall thereupon cease and determine in respect of that activity.

6. The Enterprise shall guide and assist Papua New Guinean enterprises in establishing businesses in activities ancillary to the registered activity.

7. The Enterprise shall use supplies and services available within Papua New Guinea, preferably provided by citizens provided that such supplies and services are readily available at prices and of a quality similar to those obtainable from other sources.

8. The Enterprise shall not without the prior consent of NIDA and subject to the provisions of the undertakings exchanged between NIDA and the Enterprise, manufacture any product other than fancy biscuits at any location other than its existing premises in Port Moresby.

Undertakings:**(i) NIDA to Paradise Bakery (Boroko) Pty. Limited:**

In consideration of the undertakings and in reliance upon the representations made and given in a letter from Paradise Bakery (Boroko) Pty. Limited to the National Investment and Development Authority dated 25th May, 1983, consent is hereby given under Part VI of the *National Investment and Development Act* (Ref: R. 1095) of Paradise Bakery (Boroko) Limited, (the Enterprise), for the manufacture of bakery products other than Navy Biscuits at the premises of the Enterprise at Section 159, Allotments 1, 2 and 3, Lae subject to the following conditions:—

For so long as not less than 75% of the issued shares of Lae Biscuit Company Pty. Limited are held by automatic citizens of Papua New Guinea, the Enterprise shall not without the consent of NIDA engage in the distribution of Papua New Guinea either directly or by virtue of any is not restricted in relation to shipping to and warehousing in the Port of Lae for onward delivery and distribution to provinces other than the Morobe Province.

(ii) Paradise Bakery (Boroko) Pty. Ltd. to NIDA:

In relation to the marketing of Navy Biscuit in the Highlands Region of Papua New Guinea, Paradise Bakery (Boroko) Pty. Limited undertakes that:—

(i) Subject to Paragraph 3, Paradise Bakery (Boroko) Pty. Limited, shall not engage in price cutting or discount marketing or enter into any agreement or arrangement relating to such marketing.

(ii) Should any supplier of any brand of Navy Biscuits other than a brand owned or marketed by the Paradise Group of Companies engage in cut price or discount marketing then Paradise Bakery (Boroko) Pty. Limited shall be entitled to match the price or discount offered.

(iii) Should all suppliers of Navy Biscuits reach an agreement on the price structure for the marketing of Navy Biscuits then for such time as such agreement is adhered to by the other suppliers Paradise Bakery (Boroko) Pty. Limited shall not market its product otherwise than in accordance with such agreement.

(iv) The undertakings given shall continue for such time as the condition to your consent mentioned above is in force or until reviewed by NIDA.

9. The Enterprise shall at all times conduct its operations in such a way as to minimise deleterious effects on the environment and shall abide by any reasonable standards specified by the Minister responsible for environmental matters.

10. Any application by the Enterprise to the Minister under any of these conditions shall be made in writing to NIDA.

11. The Enterprise shall notify NIDA within 30 days of the registration of its shares.
