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CONSTITUTION

AMENDMENT OF DETERMINATION OF TITLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF MINISTER

I, Peter O'Neill, Prime Minister, by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 148 of the Constitution and all other powers me enabling, hereby:—

- (a) revoke the Determination of Titles and Responsibilities of Ministers dated 3rd March, 2011 and published in the *National Gazette* No. G57 of 3rd March, 2011 (as amended); and
- (b) determine that each Minister set out in Column 1 of each Schedule shall have —
 - (i) the title specified in Column 2; and
 - (ii) the responsibilities specified in Column 3; and
 - (iii) the responsibilities for administering the Acts (or parts of the Act) specified in Column 4, and set out opposite the name of the Minister,

to come into effect on and from the date of signature of this instrument.
