## 2010 SUPPLEMENTARY APPROPRIATION ACT 2010

Short title and commencement

**1.** This Act may be cited as the 2010 Supplementary Appropriation Act 2010 and commences on the date (“commencement date”) it is published in the *Gazette*.

Authorisation and appropriation of \$177,788,400

**2.** (1) The issue from the Consolidated Fund is hereby authorised of an additional sum of one hundred and seventy-seven million seven hundred and eighty-eight thousand and four hundred dollars to be applied to the service of the year ending 31<sup>st</sup> December 2010.

(2) The sum specified in subsection (1) shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the commencement date for supply of the Heads and in the amounts respectively specified for such Heads, as set out in the Schedule.

Contingencies warrants

**3.** The total sums authorised by contingencies warrants issued by the Minister under section 15 of the Public Finance and Audit Act (Cap. 120) from the commencement date until 31<sup>st</sup> December 2010 shall not exceed –

- (a) in respect of Heads of Recurrent Expenditure, thirty million dollars; and
  - (b) in respect of Heads of Development Expenditure, thirty million dollars.
