AN ACT to amend the Trade Unions Act.

ENACTED by the National Parliament of Solomon Islands.

- Short title. 1. This Act may be cited as the Trade Unions (Amendment) Act 1988.
- Amendment of Cap. 76. 2. The Trade Unions Act is amended -
- (a) by inserting in section 2(1), in the appropriate alphabetical order, the following definition -
 - “ ‘disciplined force’ means -
 - (a) any naval, military or airforce;
 - (b) the Fire Service;
 - (c) the Prisons Service;
 - (d) the Marine Division;
 - (e) the Police Force;
 - (f) the Special Constabulary; or
 - (g) any other constabulary or police force established by Parliament”.
 - (b) by omitting section 2(2) and by inserting instead the following new subsection:-
 - “ (2) This Act does not apply to persons in a disciplined force of Solomon Islands, but otherwise it applies to employees of the Crown in the same manner as if the employees were employed by or under a private person.”.
