

## PRACTICE DIRECTION 2 OF 2014: CERTIFICATE OF CONVICTION AND SENTENCE

- 1. This practice direction applies to all criminal cases in the Supreme Court and Court of Appeal.
- 2. To ensure that sentences and convictions are accurately recorded, the Court must henceforth provide a certificate to the relevant parties and authorities including Grown Law, the Director of Prisons, Immigration Department and Probations Department. A copy must also be placed on the registry file.
- 3. Where a conviction is entered but sentence is deferred to a later date, the certifical equivil be completed and issued once the sentence has been handed down.
- 4 A certificate of conviction and sentence is a very important document. It must correctly record the conviction(s) entered and the sentence(s) passed. A registrar will ordinarily issue the certificate however in case of doubt the matter should be referred to a judge.
