JOINT REGULATION

No. 7 of
1964.

To provide for the inspection of copra.

[Joint Regulation No. 7 of 1964 was published in Condominium Gazette No. 222 and is reprinted as amended by Joint Regulation No. 25 of 1964 (Gazette No. 224).]

MADE by the British and French Resident Commissioners under the provisions of Article 2, paragraph 2, and Article 7 of the Anglo-French Protocol of 1914.

1. The Resident Commissioners may by Joint Decision appoint any officer of the Condominium Agricultural Department to be a Produce Inspector.

[2. Every Produce Inspector so appointed under the preceding section shall have the right of access to any plantation, premises, vessel or any other place having copra stored therein for the purpose of inspecting the same.

Provided that the said right of access shall only be exercised after due notice of the intention to do so has been given to the owner or occupier of the plantation, premises, vessel or any other place aforesaid.]

[3. Every Produce Inspector shall have the right to use any moisture meter or other mechanical apparatus for the purpose of verifying the quality of copra.

[4. Any person who obstructs a Produce Inspector in the exercise of his lawful duties under this Regulation commits an offence and upon conviction shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £Stg. 50 or an amount equivalent in francs at the current rate of exchange.

[5. This Regulation may be cited as the Joint Copra Inspection Regulation No. 7 of 1964 and shall be operative from the date of signature.
