## JOINT REGULATION

No. 5 of

nforce payment of fees payable by interested parties under registration judgments.

- 1. When the Registrar of the Joint Court hands over, in suance of Article 25 of the Anglo-French Convention, 1914, a y of a Judgment ordering registration of an immovable to the sistrar, he will attach thereto a statement showing all Court fees the said immovable for which he has not been able to main payment from the party interested in the Judgment.
- 2. In case of protest, by the debtors, over the said statement of made out by the Registrar of the Joint Court, the latter, at the just of all interested parties, will have the said fees taxed by the sident of the Joint Court.

[After taxation the said fees shall be enforceable in manner evided by Sections three and four of this Regulation, without ther proceedings.]

- 3. The Registrar of Land Titles will transcribe the Judgment to the Register and will establish the Title upon which he will note non-payment of the fees due to the Joint Court as per above tement. Until these fees are paid, the Registrar of Land Titles all refuse to deliver the Authentic Extract of Title and to inscribe the title in question any dealings whatsoever.
- 4. The Registrar of Land Titles will give the debtors notice of ir obligations and inform them of the consequences of non-yment, which will incur the payment of interest at the legal rate on sum payable with effect from the day of the handing over of the agment by the Registrar of the Joint Court.

This Regulation shall be cited for all purposes as the "New brides Enforcement of Payment of Court fees before delivery of the tite" Regulation No. 5 of 1930, and shall come into force the date of publication.
