

JOINT REGULATION

to increase the maxima of fines under certain regulations.

WHEREAS the Anglo-French Protocol 1914 has been amended to bring sums mentioned in francs into conformity with an exchange rate of 124 francs to the £ sterling;

And Whereas it is desirable to increase the maximum penalties prescribed in certain Joint Regulations;

(1) The maxima monetary fines mentioned in sterling and francs in the undermentioned Joint Regulations are hereby increased to £20 and 2,480 francs respectively—

No. 1 of 1929—New Hebrides Import and supply of Alcohol Regulation.

No. 6 of 1929—Sanitary Commission Regulation.

No. 7 of 1929—New Hebrides Vila Town Conservancy Regulation.

No. 8 of 1929—Inspection of Meat Regulation.

No. 2 of 1930—Native Offences Penalties Amendment Regulation.

No. 3 of 1930—New Hebrides Land Registration Regulation.

No. 4 of 1930—Licences Amendment Regulation.

(2) This Regulation shall have effect from 15th January, 1930, and shall be known for all purposes as "The New Hebrides Increase of Fines Regulation No. 2 of 1931".
