JOINT REGULATION

No. 22 of 1975

TO AMEND the Joint Telephone Service Regulation No. 6 of 1967.

MADE by the Resident Commissioners under the provisions of Articles 2:2 and 7 of the Anglo-French Protocol of 1914.

Amendment to sub-section (2) of section 4 of J.R. 6 of 1967

Addition of new Schedule to principal Regulation

- 1. Subsection (2) of section 4 of the Joint Telephone Service Regulation No. 6 of 1967 (hereinafter called "the principal Regulation") is hereby amended by the insertion of the words "Subject to the provisions of Schedule 3" at the beginning thereof.
- 2. The principal Regulation is hereby amended by the addition of the following Schedule.

SCHEDULE 3

Installation of telephone wires or apparatus by private contractor

- 1. No contractor or other person may install telephone wires or apparatus for connection with the public telephone service in any building whatsoever without having first obtained the approval of the Head of the Posts and Telecommunications Department or an officer authorized by him (hereinafter referred to as "the officer") to plans clearly showing the layout of the wiring installation and specifying the type of materials to be used in such installation.
 - 2. Upon completion of the wiring work the officer shall inspect the said work in order to ascertain that it has been carried out in accordance with the plans submitted to the Department.

In the event that the officer is not satisfied that the work has been carried out in accordance with the said plans, he may refuse permission for the installation to be connected to the public telephone system without such alterations as he can specified having first been carried out to his satisfaction.

- 3. Where the work to be carried out by a contractor or other person involves the installation of telephone equipment, working diagrams of the telephone equipment to be used in the installation must be sent by the contractor or other person to the Post and Telecommunications Department before the work commences.
- 4. In such a case the officer shall be given the opportunity to inspection the said telephone equipment in order to ascertain that all
 materials necessary for the installation of the
 equipment have been supplied together with a sufficient quantity of spare parts and adequate written
 instructions as to the maintenance of the equipment. If the officer is satisfied on these matters
 he shall authorize the contractor to proceed with
 the installations.

On completion of the work of installation of telephone equipment the officer shall fully test all equipment used in the installation in the presence of the contractor or other person who has carried out the work and may, if it is not satisfied as to the functioning or workmanship of the installation, refuse permission for the equipment to be connected with the public telephone exchange until such works as may be specified have been carried out. "

Citation and commence-ment

3. This Regulation may be cited as the Joint Telephone Service (Amendment) Regulation No. 22 of 1975 and shall come into operation on the date of its publication in the Condominium Gazette.
