CHAPTER 52

LIQUOR LICENSING (PROHIBITION OF SALE)
ORDER NO. 31 OF 1994

An order to prohibit the sale and supply of liquor throughout the Local Council regions in the interest of public peace and order during the local government councils elections.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 19 of the Liquor Licensing Act [CAP 52], I, CHARLIE NAKO, Minister of Home Affairs and Decentralization, hereby make the following order:

SALE OF LIQUOR WITHIN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT COUNCIL REGIONS

1. Subject to section 2, the sale, supply and distribution of alcoholic liquor at, or on, or from licensed premises within the Local Government Council regions of TAFEA, SHEFA, MALAMPA, PENAMA, SANMA and TORBA whether for consumption on or off the premises, is hereby prohibited from 6.30 p.m. on Monday 14th day of November, 1994 until 4.30 p.m. Wednesday 16th November, 1994.


EXCEPTION

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 1, alcoholic liquor may be sold during the said period within the normal hours of opening in restaurants and hotels to bona fide customers for consumption with their meals.

COMMENCEMENT

3. This order shall come into force on 14th November, 1994.
